MASTER OF CEREMONIES

BILL CLARK

Bill Clark is a 1971 graduate of St. John's Jesuit High School. In 1975 Bill graduated from Defiance College with a BS degree in Speech and Communications.

Bill began to work at WNWO-TV (Ch. 24) and then WTVG (Ch. 13) as a reporter and weekend anchor shortly after graduation. In 1993, after working in the corporate communications and advertising industries, Bill got back into sports and started Courtside Productions and became the Voice of high school football, basketball and baseball on WCWA-AM 1230 broadcasting close to 80 games each school year. From 1997 - 2003, Bill did play-by-play for both Owens Community College Express Men's and Women's Basketball teams. Bill was the lead broadcaster for TV5 Sports and the Buckeye CableSystem's coverage of high school football and basketball from 2000 – 2004.

Since 2000, Bill has been the Voice of Central Catholic Fighting Irish Football on Toledo's Sports Leader 106.5 The Ticket. Bill also created and hosts The Football Forum, a live weekly show on 106.5 featuring area high school football coaches and their players. His company also produces a high school football and basketball scoreboard show during those seasons.

Beginning with the 1998-1999 basketball season Bill also began working for the University of Michigan Sports Network as the studio host for UM football and basketball games on WJR 760 in Detroit. He also filled in as a basketball color analyst and play-by-play announcer on occasion. Bill had the privilege of doing the playby-play for the Wolverine's Championship in the 2004 Post Season NIT and their participation in the 04-05 Pre-Season NIT, both played at Madison Square Garden.

Since 2004 Bill has been the sideline reporter for the national radio broadcast of the Motor City Bowl (now the Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl) at Ford Field.

With WJR-760's switch to Michigan State in 2006, Bill was hired by the Spartan Sports Network to host the pre-game, halftime and post game shows for all Michigan State basketball games. He did that through the 2008 season.

In 2008 Bill joined the radio team of the Toledo Mud Hens and hosts the pre and post game shows of all Hens home games. He also provided in-game commentary and occasional play-by-play.

In 2010 Bill was the national radio play-by-play announcer for the International Bowl in Toronto working with UT Hall of Famer Chuck Ealey.

Bill has been a member of the Toledo Wistert Chapter of the National Football Foundation since 1998.

Bill and his wife Carol have three children: Christi (Brian); Jason (Vicky) and Kati (Scott). The Clarks are also the proud grandparents Jackson, Lily, Madison, Reese, Sophie, Ben, Ella, Colton and Eli.






WELCOME **BOB PINKSTON**

WISTERT CHAPTER HISTORY

Francis Michael "Whitey" Wistert (Feb 20, 1912 – April 23, 1985) was an All American football and baseball player. He played college football and baseball at the University of Michigan. Wistert was the first of the three brothers who were named All-American tackles at Michigan and later inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1967. He and his brothers (Albert and Alvin) are three of the seven players who have had their numbers retired by the Michigan football program. Whitey played on three consecutive Big Ten Conference football championship teams, including two that won back to back national championships. He was also the Big Ten Conference MVP in baseball and later played for the Cincinnati Reds.

After retiring from sports, White became a New York lawyer. He went on to become Vice President of an industrial relations firm in Toledo, Ohio. He also served in the United States Navy as a lieutenant during World War II.

In 1962, Whitey Wistert and a group of friends established the Toledo Chapter of the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. Seven members were inducted into the first honored class.

GUEST SPEAKER

JASON CANDLE

UNIVERSITY OF TOLEDO HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

For the past 16 years, no one has embodied the success of Toledo Football more than Head Coach Jason Candle. In nine seasons as Toledo's head coach, Candle has won two Mid-American Conference Championship titles and three MAC West Division crowns,

while making seven bowl appearances. He was named MAC Coach of the Year in 2017 and 2023.

Candle has won 68 games as Toledo's head coach, second in program history only to Gary Pinkel, who won 73 games from 1991-2000. No team in the Mid-American Conference has won more games than Toledo during Candle's tenure.

Candle first joined the Rockets as an assistant coach in 2009, eventually assuming the role of offensive coordinator. He took over as head coach in December of 2015, embarking on a quest to take an already outstanding program to even greater heights.

Emphasis on Academic Excellence

Academic excellence will always be a top priority for Candle and his staff. The Rockets have surpassed the 3.0 GPA mark seven times since Candle became the head coach, including a program-record 3.202 in the spring of 2023. The Rockets also have led the Mid-American Con-

ference in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) in seven of the past 10 years in which the data was released to the public, with an average score of 977.5 over the past seven years.

The Rockets also earned a 94 Graduation Success Rate (GSR) in 2023, the highest score in school history and the best mark among Mid-American Conference schools. Toledo was one of only seven schools in the nation to earn the 2022 American Football Coaches Association's Academic Achievement Award.

Coaching Origins at Mount Union

Candle joined the Rockets' staff in 2009 after spending both his playing and coaching career under head coach Larry Kehres at Mount Union.

A 2003 Mount Union graduate, Candle was an All-Ohio Athletic Conference first-team selection in 2001 as he led the team in receptions (41), yards receiving (778) and touchdowns (9). He was a key member of the 2000 and 2001 national championship teams and finished his career with 57 grabs for 1,037 yards and 11 scores.


Candle, a native of Salem, Ohio, began his coaching career at Mount Union in 2003 as the receivers coach. In the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he worked with Matt Campbell, who was the Purple Raiders' offensive coordinator at the time. Candle took over the post of offensive coordinator in 2007, and also assumed the duties as the program's recruiting coordinator.

Candle and his wife Nicole have a daughter, Avery, and two sons, Cameron and Colton.


TROY HAZUDA

Jacob played on both sides of the ball as the flex. His abilities there garnered him 1st Team All-League and 1st Team All-District awards.


Away from football Jake has volunteers at the Clinton Local Milk Drive, the youth football camp and the Clinton Community Christmas Parade.


He's also a four year member of the wrestling team, is in the National Honor Society and has been a youth wrestling coach as well.

He has a 3.89 GPA and is the son of John and Angel Goodin.




DOMINIC LINDENBERGER




IAN ROSEBROOK LIBERTY CENTER

He also plays basketball and has been the team captain for both sports.






OWEN ESPINOZA NAPOLEON


Carson is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Oak Harbor DECA and has volunteered at various sports and church camps.

He has a 4.0 grade point average and his parents are Matt and Michelle Limes.




CHASE MILLER **OTTAWA HILLS**

Isaac was an award winning running back for Perkins in 2024. Those awards included being named 1st Team All-League, 1st Team All-District and 1st Team All-State.


Isaac is a member of the National Honor Society and Impact Leadership and Move 2 Stand. He is also a flag football coach and works with Chapel Youth Mentoring.

He has a grade point average of 3.93 and is the son of Todd and Kelly Legando.




MIKE YOUNG SANDUSKY PERKINS


Away from football Joe volunteers with the Special Olympics, is on student council and is part of Youth Leadership Toledo.

He sports at 3.8 grade point average and is the son of Nicholas and Marsha Swanson.




JOSHUA ADAMCZYK SOUTHVIEW

THE JACK LUETTKE FAMILY

JACK LUETTKE

The Toledo Wistert Chapter of the National Football Foundation dedicates tonight's banquet to one of our own, Jack Luettke, who passed away in September.

Coach accepted an invitation to our board 14 years ago and was a member of no fewer than seven committees, his longest tenure being with the Scholar-Athlete Awardees and the Dedication, Distinguished Service, and Coaches' groups. He was our Michigan connection and responsible for our expansion into school coverage throughout southeastern Michigan.

We appreciated the enthusiasm, acuity, and dedication he brought to our board. He is dearly missed.

We experienced what the community of Whiteford saw up close for five decades. He was a three-sport athlete as a student at Whiteford. He graduated in 1966 after playing on teams that won 23 straight games. After graduating from Eastern Michigan, he returned to Whiteford to coach varsity football for 29 seasons and varsity baseball for 24 years. He remains the winningest coach in both of those sports at Whiteford.

Jack was Monroe County Region Coach of the Year four times in baseball and once in football (1985). He had 187 wins in football and 325 wins in baseball.

He was inducted into Michigan's High School Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame, the Whiteford Athletic Hall of Fame and, later this year, will be named to the Michigan High School Baseball Hall of Fame.

He finished his football coaching career as an assistant at Bedford High School.



DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD

TOM FERGUSON

No one epitomizes lifetime service and contribution to the Wistert Chapter of the National Football Foundation and to prep football in Northwest Ohio better than Tom Ferguson.

Born in East Toledo, Ferguson moved to Rossford at 8 years old, immediately fixing himself



into that community. He played football and basketball for the Bulldogs before earning a scholarship to Findlay where he jumped into the lineup as a running back, receiver and long snapper. That was interrupted by a stint in the Air Force; yet he returned to football at Findlay College in 1970 as a receiver's coach for two years. In 1972 he started his high school career at Milan Edison. He was an assistant football for seven years and also the head track coach and assisted in basketball.

The love affair with Rossford was continued in 1979 when Ferguson became head coach at his alma mater. He was head coach through the 2002 season. He impacted hundreds of young men, winning 119 games and six NLL titles. Rossford had the smallest enrollment in the league. He was tabbed the DIII Coach of the Year and Ohio's Coach of the Year in 1987. Twice he received the

Coaches' Award from the Wistert NFF, the chapter he would eventually lead as president for three terms.

Tom went from the sidelines to the boardroom with the National Football Foundation in 2003, when he retired from Rossford. By 2006 he was vice president and became president in 2008.

Then he began impacting the sport beyond the Rossford hallways. He became involved with the summer all-star game for graduated seniors sponsored by the Perrysburg Boosters Club and administered by Ray Pohlman, his longtime coaching rival and now the NFF's executive secretary. He provided coaching manpower and expertise that added immensely to the experience for the players.

He presided over arguably the most successful NFF banquet, that being 2011 when Jim Tressel was the speaker. He also led to the reshaping of our committee system, recruiting foundation members for their particular skill sets and then assigning them to committees where they would be effective. Ferguson hatched the idea to take our scholar athletes and guest speaker to local children hospitals to visit patients.

That program as well as the successful annual banquets brought our chapter national recognition. Tom was chosen in 2010 as one of five NFF Chapter Leadership Award recipients. He was the first from our chapter to ever receive the award. Bob Eberly would become the second in 2021.

Ferguson and his wife Susan still live in Rossford. They have two daughters, Stacy and Shelly.
